Teachers' Strikes - You may be aware from media coverage that the National Education Union (NEU) have declared strike action, which will take place on 1st February, 28th February, 15th and 16th March in our region. The strike is happening because of a national dispute between the unions and the government over teachers' pay and conditions, and not because of any issues at our school.

I'm getting in touch to give you as much notice as possible that learning may be disrupted on these dates and there may be a partial closure of the school. At the moment, I am unable to give you further details.

I recommend that you start to consider alternative childcare arrangements for these dates. I'm sorry about the potential disruption to you and to your child's education. I understand that this situation may be frustrating, and ask that all members of our school community continue to treat each other with respect.

As a trust, school leaders are working closely with our staff union representatives to keep up to date with the situation, and I will inform you of the arrangements as soon as possible.

Attendance and Absence – There were some improvements in some year groups last week and equally there were more absences in other classes. Overall 95% and above is good attendance and we are really pleased that you are supporting us with this.
