UK Parliament Workshop – On Tuesday 18th April, Year 5 and 6 took part in a fantastic workshop from the UK Parliament. During the session, children were able to learn about:

- What Parliament is
- What Parliament does
- House of Commons
- House of Lords
- Voting and Elections
- What the government is and what its role is
- Who their local MP is and what their role is
- How laws are made

Children especially enjoyed a debate about whether or not the voting age should be lowered to 16 years of age! Children debated and pass motions back and forth between the Lords at one side and the Commons at the other to demonstrate how laws are made!

Gospels for the King's Coronation – Year 6 have taken part in a very special project for the Coronation of HM King Charles III. Over fourteen schools across York have written verses from the gospels, these verses were completed on specially provided paper and beautifully bound into a set of four volumes, before getting sent to the Royal Household to celebrate the King's Coronation! Knowing that Her Late Majesty Queen Elizabeth II received a Bible at her Coronation in 1953, and in the light of the King's recent visit to York, the project will be a fitting gift from the city of York for the King.

Year 6 children wrote all 35 verses in Matthew 18 and were thrilled to see the beautifully bound volumes before they were to be sent to the Royal Household. The set of 4 Gospel books are contained in a special box and weigh in total about 8kg! Obviously, they all needed to stay in tip-top royal condition, so unfortunately, we could not let the children handle them.

The project has been completed on behalf of the City of York, YoYo (York School and Youth Trust), The Most Rev & Rt Hon Stephen Cottrell, Archbishop of York and Rev Dr Matthew Porter, Honorary Chaplain to King Charles. Many thanks to the children for their tremendous efforts and willingness to be part of the project - to offer this unique handwritten copy of the Gospels, when it is all completed, to King Charles III for his coronation.

PE News

On Friday, the Y3/4 girls played football against Hemingborough, and had a fantastic 4-1 win! It was brilliant to see all of their hard work from the training sessions paying off and all of the girls enjoyed representing our school. Coronation Celebration – On Friday 5th May the children are invited to come to school wearing red, white and blue as we will be having a special afternoon celebrating the Coronation of the King.

We are planning to play cricket, rounders and croquet before having a nice picnic together. Please can we ask that you provide a plate of picnic food for your own child (covered with cling film and named please but please can we also request NO NUTS!). We will not be able to refrigerate these plates so please include non-perishable items and it is just a small snack as the children will have had their Coronation lunch.

The children have been learning a song by the teacher/children's author, Banji Alexander. The song, New King, written from a child's perspective explores what a child would do if they suddenly became king. It is a fun song with a catchy pop hook, hip hop groove and funk base line, blended with string and horn sections reminiscent of 70s disco and soul. The children are enjoying learning this song and have been given the opportunity to prepare a dance or a routine to perform and we look forward to watching these performances during our celebrations.

Ahead of the afternoon we would also like to invite the children to design (and make if they so wish) their own crown, hat, tiara, head piece fit for a King or Queen. The designs will then be judged, on the day, with a prize for the best one in each class. The only rule is the design needs to be on A4 paper so that we can make a display of them in school. If your child does enter a design, then please ensure it is in school by Thursday 4th May.
