Phonics and Reading

We continue with our daily phonics lessons. This term we progress to learning phase 3 sounds and lots of new tricky (non-decodable) words. During our phonics lessons the children read and write daily.

Children will read at least 3 times across 2 weeks to an adult in school. They will also be provided with an ebook to read at home linked directly to the Little Wandle scheme. Reading at home is very important, we are able to monitor who reads at home and how long they spend reading each book.

Children will also continue to bring home a 'sharing story' each Friday that they will choose themselves.

The phonic homework sheet will continue to be sent home each Friday, please use it as last term. I will also load on to tapestry Little Wandle letter formation practice sheets linked to the sounds taught each week. If you wish to print them out as a little extra writing practice please do so.

<u>Maths</u>

This half term we will focus on finding, representing and exploring the composition of numbers 6, 7 and 8. We will also recap prior learning on one more one less and comparing mass and capacity.

We also practice our subitising skills daily (recognising a number of objects or pictures instantly without the need to count them). By the

end of reception children should be able to do this to 5.



<u>PSED</u>

Children will have one jigsaw session per week to teach aspects of personal, social and emotional development. This half term we will be focusing on 'Dreams and Goals'.

<u>Snack</u>

Children should have a named water bottle every day, we will happily fill up the water bottle once it is empty if required. Please only send water.

Children are offered a fruit snack in the morning (most choose this), if you wish to send an additional **small** snack please ensure it is healthy, (e.g. cracker, fruit, raisins) and MUST NOT CONTAIN NUTS. The children have just 10 minutes for snack time and they have their lunch at 11.45—they do not need a lot of snack.
