As you aware we have achieved the bronze level for the **Rights Respecting Award** and we are hoping to achieve the silver level before the end of this academic year. The children are working really hard to understand the importance of the Rights of a child and are spending time looking at specific articles.

Over the next two weeks we will be focusing on *Article 24: Every child has the right to the best possible health. Governments must provide good quality healthcare, clean water, nutritious food and a clean environment. Richer countries must help poorer countries achieve this. Linked to this, the children in Reception, Year 1 and 2 will be taking part in our Phunky Foods workshops where they will be making healthy foods and learning about healthy lifestyle choices. This will happen over the next two weeks and we know that the children will really enjoy this opportunity.*

We have also looked at Article 28: Every Child has a right to education. Our children are fortunate that they do have a broad and balanced curriculum full of exciting and enriching opportunities. As we approach SATS week we would like to emphasise the importance in ensuring pupils are in school on time each day and ensuring that children are well rested and prepared (early nights and calm mornings). The children have worked really hard all year and we are already so proud of them. We wish them every success.

Parking - We are aware that the parking issue outside of school continues to cause frustration and upset to both parents and local residents. Over the past weeks we have been alerted to some incidents that have occurred and as we are not able to intervene in issues outside of school property we have sought advice and support from PC Richard Wood, who kindly came out to see me last week. Following our visit and walk round in the neighbouring streets PC Wood has requested that the following note is shared with all parents in an attempt to reduce the risk of potential accidents and injury to our children and their families.

Hello, my name is PC1464 Richard Wood and I am the community officer that covers Escrick and surrounding villages. Over the past few weeks, I have received numerous complaints about parking around the area of Escrick CE Primary School. This include, but not limited to, parking on double yellow lines, parking on yellow zig zag lines and parking adjacent to double white lines. This is causing issues within the village at school start and finish times and this can also be dangerous for the pupils of the school. Over the coming weeks, I will be spending more time in Escrick, particularly at school start and finish times to monitor the situation, and give advice on any issues that arise. Please can I ask that you park legally and considerately and, if possible, park a short distance away from the school and walk to the school to drop off or collect children where possible.
