Miss Winfield is back in school on a phased return this week and will undertake a handover with Mr Cartledge and also finish off her parents evening appointments. We thank Mr Cartledge for all his help and commitment over these past 3 weeks and we are pleased that Miss Winfield is back.

Earlier today the children took part in a **special assembly led by PC Spooner with a focus on Road Safety**. To support their learning and understanding of this vital life skill please can we ask that you, as parents, follow the Highway Code in terms of parking in a safe and legal place when you bring/pick up your child from school. Parking near school is limited so you may need to park further in the village and walk with your child. If this is the case, then please talk to your child about the importance of road safety and how dangerous parking or driving can be if we do not follow the rules. It could have a devastating impact on a village community.

Assessment weeks – Over the next two weeks the children will be undertaking assessments in reading and maths alongside some independent writing tasks. The children in Key Stage 2 will complete maths and reading tasks in a timed setting but for all other year groups and for the writing assessments this will not be timed. As shared in our assessment information sheet

earlier this term, the purpose of this is to inform teaching and planning and to support your children with making good progress.

Positive Noticing Day is a new initiative we are running on Wednesday 4th December. We are celebrating adults and children noticing positive attributes within our school community and it allows us to support children's self esteem and outlooks towards others, situations and wider contexts. Every child will go home with a positive label that they have received that day. Further information and how you can join in at home is attached.

As a school we are using the Paul Dix materials to support behaviours – both for adults and children and Positive Noticing Day is a simple, practical and highly effective start to this additional behaviour strategy.

Our PTA have been busy arranging a number of fun events for the children to enjoy before the Christmas holidays. The money they raise at these events is much needed and often used to supplement trips, subsidise nice treats for the children and to enhance their learning opportunities. Please can you support the PTA if you can – this could be volunteering as well as signing your child up for the events that they run. Thank you.
