PARKING - A regular complaint the Neighbourhood Policing Team receives is parking outside of schools during drop off and pick up times.

To ensure the safety of the children we ask all parents and guardians to adhere to parking restrictions set outside each school.

When picking up or dropping off children at schools, you should do the following:

- Allow yourself plenty of time as the area is likely to be busy.
- Do not park on yellow zigzag lines and ideally avoid parking opposite them.
- If you decide to park further away, please be considerate of residents and avoid blocking driveways or access ways.

Dangerous parking outside school gates has long been an issue locally with repeated calls for patrols made to police on social media.

More patrols are set to be targeted as part of our patrol plan over the coming weeks.

Overall we were really pleased with the responses so thank you. We would also like to address a couple of key areas:

- I am kept well informed about my child's development we hold 2 face to face parent consultation meetings over the course of the year as well as a written end of year school report that is issued in July. We appreciate that the meetings are only 10 minutes but if we had any concerns regarding your child and their learning we would have contacted you ahead of that. Should you wish to have further information regarding your child's development or if you have any concerns about their progress then you can contact Mrs Hall who will pass any messages on this may result in a phone call with the class teacher/ and or myself.
- The school provides a good range of extra-curricular activities over the year we offer a range of clubs for different classes. Sometimes these are provided by external companies and others are offered by the staff team. We seek pupil voice as to clubs they may like but we cannot always provide this. We are happy to take parental comments on this at the next parent forum meeting.
- The school website is useful and the content is up to date since becoming part of SYMAT we have lost control over our website. This is now held centrally and overseen by a member of the central SYMAT team, therefore we have to contact them to upload documents etc. We appreciate that this is not ideal as there can be a time lag but they also try to keep the Trust websites aligned so there are less up to date photos etc. We are aware of this but sadly at this time there is very little we can do.
