Teaching and Learning – As always, I enjoy spending time in the classes with the children; watching them learn and develop new skills and interests. Over the course of this half term I have reviewed numerous teaching and learning sessions and across our school there is a great attitude to learning which is underpinned with outstanding behaviours for learning.

Children in Mercury are making super progress with their phonics; showing confidence to sound out and blend new digraphs and tricky words. Letter formation and writing skills are developing along with their attitudes to writing tasks.

In Venus I have seen the children develop their independent writing skills – with a clear focus on using the correct punctuation and higher level vocabulary. The children have drafted and edited their sentences to check that key features have been included. **Children in Earth** have shown great focus on learning their five and ten times tables which is essential knowledge to solve further maths problems.

Children in Mars have been engaged in their story plan; considering the different elements in a story from setting the scene to creating a mysterious problem and then a resolution. The children's ideas have been inspired by their class book The Night Gardener. **Children in Jupiter** have been working hard on their story plans — creating suspense through description and dialogue. The engagement and enthusiasm in their class is outstanding!

In Saturn the children have been learning about the Ancient Egyptians – their Gods, beliefs and ways of life. The children have used research skills to increase their knowledge. Work in maths has provided opportunities for the children to consolidate how to read the scales on a protractor and solving word problems with this knowledge.

Our Year 6 children are in the process of completing another round of practice SATS papers. They are showing more maturity, focus and determination alongside increased pace to ensure all questions are answered within the time limit. They are constantly working hard and should be proud of themselves as their attitudes and behaviours are exemplary to all – thank you Year 6!
