Dear Parents and Carers,

We have had a fantastic first week back. The children have settled in brilliantly and have returned with enthusiasm and a positive attitude towards their learning. Despite the crisp winter weather, they have embraced outdoor activities and enjoyed playtimes. As the weather is colder and wet please can I ask that ALL children come to school with a coat and sensible shoes. Also, if your child has their **forest school session**, they need to have layers to put on so they are warm and can then enjoy the full range of activities. If your child has come to school in forest school clothes as their lesson is first thing, please can we remind you that the children will need some also some dry socks/tights and school shoes, as well as uniform to change into after their lesson.

Last week the children completed some work reflecting on the term **‘Spirituality’** and what it means to them. Spirituality can be a gentle, grounding thread in a child’s development, helping them make sense of themselves, others, and the wider world. In school, it often means encouraging children to pause, wonder, reflect, and recognise that life has depth beyond the everyday. This might involve exploring big questions, noticing beauty in nature, showing gratitude, or thinking about how their actions affect others. By working with children to define what spirituality means to them—through discussion, storytelling, reflection activities, and shared experiences—we help them build a personal understanding that feels real and relevant. It becomes less about giving them a fixed definition and more about guiding them to recognise moments of awe, compassion, connection, and purpose in their own lives.

As the half term progresses, we will be sharing with you our definitions and how these link to the curriculum delivered in our school.

These remain an important foundation for the values we uphold and the relationships we nurture within school and beyond.
